This unique museum of regional history is located at the mountaintop home of Dr. William Henry Burritt. The remarkable [14-room mansion](#) built in the shape of an X in the 1930s is insulated with 2,200 bales of wheat straw. The [Historic Park](#) features restored farm buildings which interpret 19th century rural life in Alabama. A [nature trail](#) winds through heavily wooded forest. The grounds, open year-round, offer a breathtaking panoramic view of Huntsville and the Tennessee Valley. On a clear day you can see the Tennessee River and the towering NASA rocket test stands. Don't miss the authentic reproduction of a Rosenthal School.

Visit the hsvmuseum.org for all of the current and upcoming exhibitions. Located at Big Spring Park in the heart of downtown. If you have time, go across the street, and check out the spring. This feeds the lagoon and canal that went to the Tennessee River. Cotton that was sold downtown was floated to ships waiting at the river.

It's a bit of a ride from the hotel, but it's really an unforgettable place. Mooreville is the first town incorporated by the Alabama Territorial Legislature, on November 16, 1818. The entire town is on the National Register of Historic Places and is one of Alabama's most important and intact villages. Historic homes and buildings, gracious gardens and tree-shaded streets make a visit to Mooreville seem like a step back in time. Tom Sawyer movie was filmed here. No need to build sets! Don't miss a look at the 1818 Farm and their babydoll sheep and the hand steeple with the finger pointing to heaven on the church.

Over 210 years ago, Huntsville became the first incorporated town in the Alabama Territory, and a few of the structures featured below are almost that old. Many others are between 120- and 200-years old.

If you live in the deep south but can't make it to Savannah, Charleston, New Orleans or St. Augustine to enjoy the spectacular historic places found in those cities as often as you would like, Huntsville may be the next best thing.

*Directions – Take 431 West, aka Governors Drive (this is road hotel is on)
Right on Madison Street
Left on Adam.
Don't miss Cruise Alley. It's off Adams.
Ride around in this area. It's 13 blocks square.

Lowe Mill Arts & Entertainment

Housed in a former cotton mill: [Lowe Mill ARTS & Entertainment](https://lowemill.art/portfolio/), is located just southwest of the heart of Huntsville and in its namesake, the Lowe Mill District, is the largest, privately-owned arts facility in the South. With a focus on visual arts, this historic factory building has been redeveloped into more than 150 working studios for over 200 artists, makers and independent businesses, 7 art galleries, a multi-use theatre, 4 performance venues, restaurants, a foundry, a chocolate shop, and a community garden. The open door policy allows the public to visit artists and makers during the different stages of their creative process. Free entry. Ride the original freight elevator to get upstairs.
